REGISTERING FOR THE 2016 YALE YOUNG GLOBAL SCHOLARS-BEIJING PROGRAM

Participants who do not adhere to the above deadlines risk forfeiting their seat in the 2017 Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program.

(1) Reply Form Requirements: Due December 7, 2016

Confirm your attendance by submitting the admissions reply form (You may access this form directly from your application status page at https://apply.globalscholars.yale.edu/apply/status.)

If you are unable to attend the program this winter, please let us know as soon as possible and no later than December 7. It is important that you inform us immediately so we can make arrangements for another student on the waitlist to attend the program.

(2) Enrollment Deposit Requirements: Due December 7, 2016

Once you accept your offer of admission to the Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program, a \$500.00 USD enrollment deposit payment is due, unless your decision letter states that you were awarded a full tuition scholarship. **Note: you will not be able to pay your enrollment deposit until you have completed the reply form.**

The enrollment deposit is non-refundable. A visa letter from YYGS-Beijing, intended to supplement your visa application, will be provided to you once the deposit has been paid.

(3) Registration Form Part 1 (Contact and Other Information, Insurance Information & Healthcare Providers, Medications, Health History, Immunizations, and Release Forms) Requirements: Due December 7, 2016

Registration will be processed through our online CampDoc.com portal. CampDoc.com is an electronic record system that helps us consolidate and integrate participant health, release, and travel information into a centralized and secure location. Your privacy will always be protected as the CampDoc.com site is secure, encrypted, and password-protected.

Soon after you are offered a place in the program, you will receive a "Welcome E-mail" from CampDoc.com with information on how to begin the registration process for YYGS-Beijing. The email will come from notifications@campdoc.com but will appear in your inbox as coming from "Yale Young Global Scholars". Please set notifications@campdoc.com as a "safe sender" to avoid accidental delivery to junk and spam folders. Your registration materials must be submitted to participate in the Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program.

To complete Part 1 of the Registration Forms, please prepare the materials below:

- 1) Health history, immunization record, and medication information
- 2) Health insurance card (if your policy will cover you in China) SCAN and UPLOAD into CampDoc.com
- 3) Government-issued photo ID (Chinese citizens ONLY) or Passport (all other participants) SCAN AND UPLOAD into CampDoc.com

The online form will only accept documents in PDF (.pdf), JPG, GIF, and PNG format. The maximum file size is 5MB.

(4) Tuition Balance Requirements: Due December 22, 2016

Once you have paid your enrollment deposit, a link to pay your tuition balance will appear on your Applicant Status Page (https://apply.globalscholars.yale.edu/apply/status)

For Scholarship Recipients:

If you received need-based financial assistance to attend the YYGS-Beijing Program, you were notified of the amount in your decision letter. Financial aid operates as a tuition discount. If you received a full tuition discount, the deposit and balance tuition payments are automatically waived. If you received a partial tuition discount, your deposit and balance payments due will automatically reflect the discount received.

(5) Registration Form Part 2 (Travel Forms) Requirements: Due December 22, 2016.

You must complete Part 2 of the registration form, which is an online travel information form, so the Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program staff can prepare for your arrival.

All participants must provide travel information. Participants should arrange travel as soon as possible.

Recommended travel options can be found on page 7 of this packet.

Please ensure that Part 1 and Part 2 of the registration forms are accurate and complete before you submit them. The CampDoc.com registration form automatically saves any information you input so you may start the form and complete it at a later time if necessary.

If there are any changes to the information after you have completed these health and travel forms, you may update your records through January 24, 2017. On January 25, 2017 this profile will be locked and you will not be able to make further changes unless approved by The Yale Young Global Scholars Program - Asia. PROGRAM LOGISTICS

Arrival and Departure

Check-in time: Between 9:00am – 3:00pm on Friday, February 3, 2017 Check-out time: Before 12:00pm on Saturday, February 11, 2017

Students will check-in and check-out from the Beijing Jinglun Hotel. Students are expected to be present for the duration of the program. Any special circumstances where the students need to arrive late, depart early, or leave for any amount of time during the program must be approved by program staff prior to arrival. Please specify early or late arrival circumstances in the **Travel Form by December 22, 2016**.

Housing

The Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program provides housing to all participants at the <u>Beijing Jinglun Hotel</u>, a four-star hotel located in the center of the Beijing Central Business District, and within walking distance of Yale Center Beijing. YYGS staff will be escorting students to Yale Center Beijing from the hotel's lobby every morning and return to the hotel together every evening. It is required that all participants reside in the hotel for the duration of the program. Housing is included in tuition fees.

YYGS-Beijing participants will stay in single-gender double rooms with a shared private bathroom. Staff members and instructors will also reside at the hotel. Students will receive a key card to their room upon arrival to the program. All participants will have a roommate.

Meals

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner will be provided every day throughout the program to participants, in addition to snacks. All meals are included in tuition fees.

Meals begin with dinner on Friday, February 3, 2017 and end with breakfast on Saturday, February 11, 2017. Participants who arrive early should plan to bring extra money to purchase their own food.

Please indicate any specific dietary needs or restrictions, including food allergies and religious observances, on your Registration Form by December 7 so that we can work to accommodate your needs.

Laundry Facilities

Laundry facilities will not be available at any point during YYGS-Beijing. Participants are encouraged to bring enough clothing for the duration of the program

Wi-Fi and Electronic Equipment

Yale Center Beijing has wireless network connectivity available, and program participants will be provided with access to the secure network upon check-in. The Beijing Jinglun Hotel also offers complimentary Wi-Fi to all guests.

Each participant is strongly encouraged to bring an electronic note-taking device (laptop, tablet, or smart phone) and is responsible for its security. These devices will be useful for the seminars and team-based activities. If you do not anticipate bringing an electronic note-taking device, bringing print-outs of the seminar readings to reference in class is strongly recommended. Participants should note whether or not they are able to bring a laptop, tablet, or smart phone with them on their Registration Form.

TRAVELING TO BEIJING AND THE YALE CENTER BEIJING

Participants in the Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program are responsible for arranging their own travel to Beijing. Please plan to arrive in Beijing no later than 2:30 p.m. on February 3, 2017, the first day of the program. Orientation programming and activities at Yale Center Beijing will begin promptly at 4:00 p.m.

If you cannot arrive by 3:00 p.m., you may arrive the previous day and stay at the Beijing Jinglun Hotel at an additional cost of \$40 USD per night. Please indicate this on your travel form and we will make the necessary reservations.

At the conclusion of the program, all participants must check out of their room no later than 12:00 p.m. on departure day. Please note that it is not possible to stay on site after this time, nor can the program or staff be responsible for any participant after the program concludes.

Please enter your arrival and departure information online in the Travel Form no later than December 22, 2016.

By Plane

If you are flying internationally, we strongly suggest flying into Beijing Capital International Airport (PEK). Beijing Capital Airport is approximately 25 miles from central Beijing, and is served by hundreds of airlines from airports all over the world.

YYGS-Beijing will provide an airport shuttle from Beijing Capital International Airport to Yale Center Beijing from 8:00 am to 2:30 pm on Friday, February 3, 2017. All participants arriving at an alternate date/time or by alternate means will be responsible for arranging their own transportation to Yale Center Beijing. Please check with your airline for unaccompanied minor procedures (if applicable). **The Yale Young Global Scholars Program does not provide arrival escorts/chaperones for students who choose to travel as unaccompanied minors (UMs) with their airlines.** YYGS will not register staff members at the airport to "sign-out" arriving participants and are not able to accompany any unaccompanied minors to or from the airport.

YYGS- Beijing will provide an airport shuttle at 12:00pm (noon) from Yale Center Beijing for participants flying out of Beijing Capital International Airport at the conclusion of the program on Saturday, February 11, 2017. Participants flying out at all other times or by other means will be responsible for arranging their own transportation from Beijing and Yale Center Beijing.

By Train/Bus

Most of Beijing's long-distance bus and train stations are conveniently served by Beijing extensive Metro system. The Yale Center Beijing is located at the Guomao (国贸) station, accessible from Line 1 or Line 10.

Participants arriving by train, bus, car, or flying into any other airport will be responsible for arranging their own travel to the Yale Center Beijing. Participants arriving on Thursday, February 2, 2017 should arrange their own travel directly to Beijing Jinglun Hotel.

PREPARING FOR THE PROGRAM

Travel Documents

Participants traveling to the program from within China must have appropriate identification to do so.

Participants traveling to the program from outside of China are responsible for securing a valid passport (that will remain valid for up to six months *after* the program) and a Chinese visa to travel to China for the duration of the program.

Non-Chinese participants in the Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program usually enter China on an **F visa for "Foreigners who intend to go to China for exchanges, visits, study tours and other non-business activities."** Yale Center Beijing is not awarding academic credit for this program, nor are participants registered as students of Yale University, so participants DO NOT need to apply for X2 student visas to attend the program. It is highly recommended that students check with the local Chinese Embassy in their home country and city before they submit their visa application.

If you must obtain a visa to travel to China to attend the program, our program staff will provide you an official letter from the YYGS program to supplement your visa application. The letter will be provided upon receipt of your reply form and enrollment deposit.

Health Insurance

The Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program requires that all participants be covered by health insurance during the program, including during travel to and from the program. In Part 1 of the registration form, participants who will have coverage in China under their existing plans must upload a copy of a valid health insurance card (front and back).

For national and international participants who do not have health insurance, it will be provided for you for the duration of the program as part of tuition at no extra cost.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

The Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program is an intensive educational experience that combines lectures from top faculty, elective seminars, a research project and presentation, as well as other unique academic and recreational activities to give talented high school leaders from all over the world a chance to challenge themselves, meet other extraordinary students, and get a taste of American university life. Program activities regularly run from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. each day, and students are expected to be full participants in all program classes and events.

Session Schedules

A final session schedule will be sent to all participants in December, but a draft schedule is appended at the end of this Welcome Packet.

Seminar Preferences

Participants will participate in four (4) different elective seminars during the session. All seminars are specially developed for the Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program and are taught by undergraduates and graduate students from Yale serving as instructors in the program. Participants will receive information about submitting seminar preferences in December, including seminar titles, descriptions, and a form to submit seminar preferences. Please note that while we cannot guarantee that participants will be placed in their top choice seminars, the YYGS-Beijing staff will do its best to place participants in one of their top three choices.

Seminar assignments will be released in early January. Students will be required to do a modest amount of reading assigned by their seminar instructors prior to arrival at YYGS-Beijing. If you do not anticipate bringing an electronic note-taking device, bringing print-outs of the seminar readings to reference in class is strongly recommended.

Readings

Most seminars will have required readings. Participants will receive readings 2-3 weeks prior to the program start via email, and will be able to download these files in.pdf format. Readings should be completed before the session begins, as participants will have very limited time to do reading during the program.

INFORMATION ON BEIJING

Safety and Health

Beijing, with a population of almost 20 million people, is generally safe when compared with other major urban areas. The police and security service presence throughout the city serve to deter most serious crimes, while petty crimes do occur with some regularity. Therefore, it is important for students to always be aware of their surroundings at all times whenever entering or exiting the Yale Center Beijing or the Beijing Jinglun Hotel. Students will always have adult supervision when walking the short distance from the Hotel to the Center.

Chinese food may be unfamiliar to students who are not entirely acculturated to the cuisine. All meals will be catered from reputable restaurants, but it is important to take precautions when eating local food. Antacids including Imodium or Pepto-Bismol are recommended especially for students with sensitive stomachs. Tap water is **NOT** safe to drink in China, but bottled water will be provided to all students. For any more serious illnesses that may arise, students will be treated according to parental permissions at the foremost Western hospital in Beijing, Beijing United Family Hospital.

Check the vaccines and medicines list in the registration form, and visit your doctor (ideally, 4-6 weeks) before your trip to get any necessary vaccinations or other medication that you will need for China.

Communication

Due to the "Great Firewall of China", many websites in common use in the rest of the world are not accessible in China. These include Google, Gmail, Facebook, YouTube, the New York Times, and more. Individual websites can be tested in real-time using this link: http://www.blockedinchina.net/

As a result, non-Chinese students are encouraged to register for a Hotmail or Yahoo email address for the duration of the program to communicate with friends and family outside of China. Alternatively, popular apps like WhatsApp, Skype and Facetime will still be accessible. Students may be interested in bypassing the Great Firewall by purchasing a VPN. The best and most reliable paid VPN for China is Astrill.

Electricity

The electricity in China is generally 220V, 50HZ, AC. Depending on where you live, a voltage converter may be necessary for using your electrical devices in China. In addition, as the shape of a socket varies between countries, a portable plug adaptor may also be necessary. The Chinese standard socket is common in China, Australia, and New Zealand, but in few other countries. We strongly recommend purchasing any converters and/or adapters prior to your arrival to YYGS-Beijing.

Air Pollution

Air pollution is an ongoing serious matter in Beijing. The air quality is measured in China in terms of AQI (Air Quality Index). The air quality in Beijing may be hard for people who have heart and respiratory system conditions. YYGS suggests its students to wear N95 respirators when going outside on heavily polluted days.

WHAT TO BRING AND FAQs

What should I bring to the program?

Sheets, bath towels, a blanket, and a pillow are provided to participants.

- Down or other substantial winter jacket
- Thick sweater
- Gloves, hat, scarf
- Warm shoes and socks
- Toiletries (shampoo, soap, deodorant/antiperspirant)
- Pens or pencils and notebooks
- School bag for notebooks
- Umbrella
- Prescription medications in original bottles/containers with dosage information (with English translation, if applicable)
- Electronic note-taking device (laptop, tablet, or smart phone) and charger
- Voltage transformer and adaptor (if traveling from outside China)
- Imodium or Pepto-Bismol
- N95 mask

Pharmacies and convenience stores are just a short distance away and sell toiletries, sundries, snacks, and other goods. If you forget something, you can usually purchase items locally when you arrive in Beijing.

What should I wear while I'm at YYGS-Beijing?

The dress code at Yale Center Beijing is a fairly relaxed one, and we promote a professional but comfortable learning environment at YYGS-Beijing. However, participants should keep in mind that they will be interacting with Yale University faculty and staff on a daily basis. Here is what we suggest:

- For the morning, afternoon and evening sessions: long-sleeve or polo shirts, or blouses, and jeans, or pants.
- For the final program exercise and end-of-program dinner and graduation event: One or two dressy outfits such as dresses, suits, blouse/shirt and skirt/slacks, blazer with tie, or similar.
- Please leave at home: Cut-offs, "short" shorts, mini-skirts, halter or strapless tops, "muscle shirts", shirts with large graphics or type, ripped, shredded, or damaged clothing, party clothing or club wear, clothing that is distracting or otherwise of poor/questionable taste.

The average high temperatures in Beijing in early February are around 35°F (1.67°C), and the average low temperatures can drop as low as 10°F (-12.2°C), so be prepared! Though most of the program will be conducted indoors, we recommend dressing warmly and in layers, as we will have some outdoor excursions, including a trip to the Great Wall, where it will be very cold. Yale Center Beijing and the Beijing Jinglun Hotel will be heated.

Do I need to bring spending money?

Tuition covers housing and three meals per day, so basic needs are covered. However, you should bring funds to cover your personal expenses such as snacks, bottled water, supplies, and any local shopping (souvenirs, personal purchases, etc.). It is also recommended that you bring money for meals if you plan to arrive prior to February 3. Banks with ATM machines are located near Yale Center Beijing and accept Visa and Mastercard.

However, in order to avoid the foreign transaction fee and hassle, it is recommended to convert money at the airport or in your hometown prior to arriving for the program. In addition, most vendors do not accept credit cards or traveler's checks.

IMPORTANT PROGRAM POLICIES

The Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program has high expectations of student conduct. Adult supervision is provided at all times during the program, but students are expected to be responsible members of the program community. Please do not bring any items to program that will jeopardize your program experience or the experience of others.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL POLICY

Alcohol and other controlled substances not specifically prescribed to a student are absolutely prohibited at the program, including inside the bedrooms. YYGS-Beijing has a zero tolerance policy. Any student found possessing, consuming, buying, trading, distributing, or selling alcohol or other drugs will be asked to leave the program immediately, and may be subject to criminal penalties. Even if a student is of legal age, they are not permitted to consume alcohol for the duration of the program.

Students who are prescribed controlled substances must keep all medications in original containers with prescription information in the YYGS-Beijing program office. A member of the program staff will record and dispense the indicated dosage directly to the student.

SMOKING AND TOBACCO POLICY

Tobacco products, including but not limited to cigarettes, chewing tobacco, and electronic smokeless cigarettes ("e-cigs"), are prohibited on the program site.

GAMBLING POLICY

Any gambling activities during the program are prohibited.

WEAPONS POLICY

Weapons of any kind are strictly prohibited in the Yale Young Global Scholars-Beijing Program.

NO RECORDING-BLOGGING-ATTRIBUTION POLICY

The YYGS-Beijing program is conducted as an academic program where free expression and vigorous debate are not only encouraged but also expected. We want our students to be intellectually courageous and our invited presenters to be free to speak "off the record" without concern that what they say in an academic environment will appear in the public domain, including on the internet, at any time during or after their participation or presentation.

We maintain a strict policy that prohibits any video, audio or digital recording of program sessions including lectures, briefings, seminars, discussion sessions, and presentations. Participants may take photographs during the program for personal use only. Photography is not allowed during lectures, seminars, classes, or presentations in order to avoid disruption of instructional time.

CELL PHONE POLICY

Participants are allowed to bring cell phones to the program but will not be permitted to use them during classes or seminars.

Participants who are in violation of YYGS-Beijing policies may be dismissed from the program and, if applicable, subject to additional criminal penalties.
